This language is for the illustration of various forms of bequests only. Always consult your professional advisor when making or revising your will.

RESIDUARY BEQUEST

"Residue" is a term to describe the portion of your estate that remains after all debts, expenses, and specific bequests to others have first been fulfilled. You can make a bequest by including language in your will or living trust, leaving a portion of your estate to **Knock Knock Children's Museum**.

"All the rest, residue, and remainder of my estate I give to **Knock Knock Children's Museum**, located in Baton Rouge, Louisiana, Tax ID 73-1701786, for its general purposes."

DONATION OF REAL ESTATE BY WILL

"I leave to **Knock Knock Children's Museum**, located in Baton Rouge, Louisiana, the real property described as follows: (*property description*). I direct my Executor/Personal Representative to sell the above-described real property and distribute the proceeds to **Knock Knock Children's Museum**, located in Baton Rouge, Louisiana, Tax ID 73-1701786, for its general purposes."

BENEFICIARY DESIGNATION: DONATIONS OF LIFE INSURANCE, IRA, DONOR-ADVISED FUNDS (DAF) OR OTHER PENSION/RETIREMENT PLANS

You can name **Knock Knock Children's Museum** as a beneficiary of your bank accounts, investment accounts, life insurance policy, Donor Advised Fund (DAF), and retirement assets including IRAs, Roth IRAs, 401(k)s and 403(b)s and other pension plans. Beneficiary designation forms, available from the institutions where you have your accounts, work to pass those assets directly to the beneficiaries you name.

A will typically does not dispose of assets such as life insurance and pension plans, which usually pass by "beneficiary designation." A beneficiary designation is a contract between you and your insurance company or pension plan administrator to transfer the asset at your death to the person(s) or institution(s) you have designated (usually in the initial paperwork you completed to establish the asset). To designate **Knock Knock Children's Museum** as the beneficiary of such an asset, you should contact your insurance company or plan administrator and request a "change of beneficiary" form, which you can complete and return to them.
